Due to the COVID-19/Coronavirus crisis and in accordance with Governor Sununu's Emergency Orders, this Board is authorized to meet electronically.

Please note that there is no physical location to observe and listen contemporaneously to the meeting, which was authorized pursuant to the Governor's Emergency Order. However, in accordance with the Emergency Order, this is to confirm that we are:

a) Providing public access to the meeting by telephone, with additional access possibilities by video or other electronic means;

The subcommittee will utilize the Microsoft Teams meeting platform for this electronic meeting. All members of the Commission have the ability to communicate contemporaneously during this meeting through the Teams platform, and the public has access to contemporaneously listen and, if necessary, participate in this meeting through dialing the following phone # **+1 929-229-5722** and **Conference ID: 863 242 226#** or by clicking this link [Join Microsoft Teams Meeting](#).

b) Providing public notice of the necessary information for accessing the meeting;

c) Providing a mechanism for the public to alert the public body during the meeting if there are problems with access;

d) Adjourning the meeting if the public is unable to access the meeting.

In the event the public is unable to access the meeting, we will adjourn the meeting and have it rescheduled at that time.

Please note that all votes taken during this meeting shall be done by Roll Call vote as will meeting attendance.

How To Attend a Fremont NH Virtual Board Meeting

In accordance with Governor Sununu's Emergency Order #12 and pursuant to Executive Order 2020-04, Fremont Boards are authorized to meet electronically. Please note that there is no physical location to observe and listen contemporaneously to the meeting, which was authorized pursuant to the Governor's Emergency Order. However, in accordance with the Emergency Order each Board will:

- a) Provide public access to Board meetings by telephone, with additional access possibilities via the internet on your computer or phone or other Personal Device.
- b) Provide public notice of the necessary information for accessing the meeting. Information for each meeting will be posted online and on the front door of the Town Hall. As is the case with in-person public meetings, you can join virtual Town meetings anytime.
- c) Provide a mechanism for the public to alert the public body during the meetings. If there are problems with access by calling the Town Hall at 603 895-3200 and dialing the relevant extension for the Board having the meeting (i.e., Land Use Office Extension 306 or Selectmen's Office Extension 301).
- d) Adjourn the meeting if the public is unable to access the meeting.

The Fremont Boards including Planning and Zoning will have the ability to meet using the **Microsoft Teams** meeting platform.

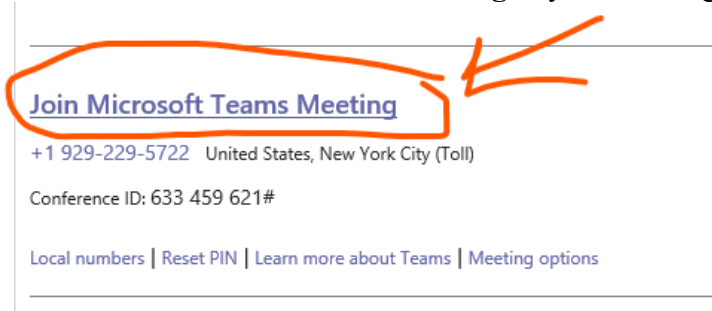
Microsoft Teams meetings are best experienced when you join them from the Teams app or Teams on the web. If you can't use the app or the web, you may call-in in using a phone number and conference id number which will be provided for each meeting.

As a reminder you may also contact anyone at the Town Hall prior to or after the meeting and view meetings live via FCTV Channel 22 or after the meeting by Vimeo (posted shortly after each meeting closes). Below is more information on how to join Fremont meetings.

Join by link – By Mobil Device or Computer

If you know you want to attend a meeting in advance someone can send you a meeting invitation. Call or email the Town Hall Department of interest to request a meeting invitation. All we need is your email address.

Select **Join Microsoft Teams Meeting** in your meeting invite



This link will take you to a page where you can choose to either join on the web or download the desktop app.

If you already have the Teams app, the meeting will open using the link automatically.

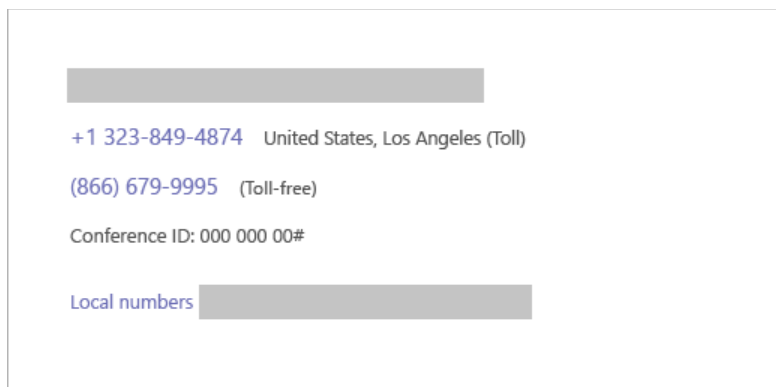
If you don't have a Teams account you have the option to enter your name to join the meeting as a guest. The Teams software is free. When you join the meeting we ask that you enter your full name and address if space allows to help with public roll call requirements. **If you do have a Teams account**, select **Sign in** to join with access to the meeting chat and more. Then, depending on the organizer's settings, you may join the meeting right away or go to the virtual lobby where people in the meeting can admit you.

Note: Please download the app before the meeting starts. It might take a minute or two, depending on your internet connection.

Call in

If you're unable to use the Teams app or Teams on the web, you can join some meetings by calling a phone number.

If there's a phone number and conference ID in the meeting invite, just dial the number to join. You will be asked to announce your name when you join the meeting.



The number in your invitation may not be local to you. Select **Local numbers** to find one that is.
