

TIME TO LICENSE YOUR DOG

2023 dog licenses are due by April 30th

A current rabies certificate is required, please email the Clerk's Office to inquire if the rabies certificate on file is still valid. You must license your dog before April 30th to avoid the initiation of a late penalty of \$1.00 per month. For your convenience, the license(s) can be mailed for and additional fee of \$1.00 per license, or you can relicense your dog(s) online by going to the Town Clerk page on the

Town's website at www.fremont.nh.gov and select E-Dog. To relicense online, you must have the prior year tag license number. If you no longer have your dog, please contact the Clerk's office so they can update their records accordingly. Any questions can be directed to the Clerk's office via email at

<u>clerkcollector@fremont.nh.gov</u> or 603 895 8693 x 307. You can also drop off your paperwork in the drop box, or at the Town Office anytime.

NH LOW & MODERATE INCOME TAX RELIEF

The State's 2022 Form DP-8 for the Low- and Moderate-Income Property Tax Relief should be available soon. Once released from DRA, you will be able to pick up a copy from the Select Board's Office or use the web fill-in form and print it. We will mail out copies to those who have requested the form in prior years. It will also be available as a link from the Town's website once posted by the NH DRA. The State no longer mails the forms out, so be sure to get yours after April 15th. Forms must be filed by June 30, 2023.

Contact the Select Board's Office at 603 895 2226 to have one mailed out to you, or check the State website at: http://revenue.nh.gov/forms/low-moderate.htm to fill out and print your form online. From that page, you will need to get Form DP-8 for the 2022 tax year.

PUBLIC HEARING TOWN OF FREMONT NH

The Fremont Select Board will hold a Public Hearing in accordance with NH RSA 31:95-b on Thursday March 30, 2023 at 7:00 pm at the Fremont Town Hall, basement meeting room, 295 Main Street, to accept a grant of \$10,000 from the Fields Pond Foundation for the Glen Oakes Expansion Project, to aid in the fee simple purchase of parcel 04-077.

NEW HAMPSHIRE FUEL & ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Fuel Assistance Program provides grant benefits from \$304 to \$3,024 for heating purposes that do not have to be repaid to eligible homeowners and renters for the winter season as follows:

If your heat is electric or natural gas, bills from November 1st can be paid until your benefit amount is used up or the program year ends.

If your heat is from deliverable fuels, oil, kerosene, propane, wood or coal, deliveries made from October 1st – April 30th can be paid until your benefit amount is used up or the program year ends.

If your heat is included in your rent and is NOT subsidized, assistance will be provided in the form of heating vouchers issued in amounts of up to \$504 each month until your benefit amount is used up or the program year ends.

*If your heat is included in your rent and IS subsidized, you will not qualify for Fuel Assistance, but you may qualify for Electric Assistance.

The legislature recently approved \$25 million in State General Funds for the State Emergency Fuel Assistance Program (SEFAP) and \$10 million in General Funds for the State Supplemental Electric Benefit Programs (SSEBP). Southern New Hampshire Services, the Community Action Program administering the funding for the State program for District Three, encourages all District Three residents who believe they might be at or below 75% of State Median Income to apply - disbursements are anticipated for December.

Any residents who apply and are below the 60% State Median Income will be enrolled in the Fuel Assistance Program (FAP). Any

residents who apply and are between 61% - 75% State Median Income, which does not meet the regular fuel assistance guidelines, will be in the system and ready to be enrolled in the new Emergency State Program with a benefit being paid out as early as December.

The Fuel Assistance Program application deadline is April 30, 2023.

Southern NH Services is the Community Action Program for District Three/Rockingham County. Apply online or visit one of the five SNHS offices for electric assistance, fuel assistance, weatherization assistance.

The Town has been notified that this program still has significant funding available. If you THINK you might be eligible, PLEASE APPLY as soon as possible!

ARE YOU BEHIND IN PAYING YOUR MORTGAGE, PROPERTY CHARGES, OR UTILITIES BECAUSE OF COVID-19?

The NH Homeowner Assistance Fund provides assistance to eligible residents who are past due in paying their home mortgage, property taxes, home insurance, association fees, or utilities due to Covid-19 pandemic. Apply at www.HomeHelpNH.org.

ELIGIBLE HOMEOWNERS

- Must have experienced a COVID-19 pandemic related reduction in income or increase in expenses that occurred after January 21, 2020 or began prior to but continued after that date.
- Must own and occupy, as their primary residence, the New Hampshire property for which assistance is requested.
- Must have income (s) of equal to or less than 125% of Area Median Income.

ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES: Must be owner-occupied or in the case of a land contract or contract for deed, occupied by the documented buyer. Eligible properties include:

- A single-family (attached or detached) properties
- Condominium units
- 1–4-unit properties where one of the units is the homeowner's primary residence
- Manufactured/modular homes permanently affixed to rest property and taxed as real estate
- Manufactured homes not permanently affixed to real property but with a Title Certificate or Statement of Ownership in the homeowner's name
