Fremont Cub Scout Pack 1 is working with Raymond Pack 100 to put backpacks together to assist those who have been affected by the tragedies in Japan. The backpacks will hopefully have one package of socks and underwear and some clean, dry clothing (gently used and clean is

fine). It can be pants, shirts, shorts, absolutely anything. They also are hoping for small blankets, toothbrushes, body soap, other toiletry items, first aid items such as bandaids, and wipes. To help comfort the children, items like small stuffed animals, dolls, and toy cars, as well as coloring books and crayons are also being collected. The idea is for one bag to have a change of clothing for one child at a minimum.

The shipments will be going to the Far East Council and they will be getting them to agencies helping with the relief efforts. Items will also be sent to Peace Wind Japan, which is a humanitarian group, as well as contacting several Japanese churches to see if they will accept donations. We will be collecting until May or June at the earliest, with shipments going out every week.

We are also asking scouts to collect pennies in jars to help with shipping costs, as well as placing coin collection jars in the Village Market and Liberty Square Market. The collection bins for the items will be located at the Ellis School and the Town Hall.

#### **DOG LICENSES FOR 2011**

Dog licenses are now overdue. Beginning June 1, 2011 a \$1.00 penalty per dog, per month, will be added to the normal licensing fees. Any unlicensed dog will also be subject to a civil forfeiture fee of \$25.00 per dog in accordance with RSA 466:13. The forfeiture fee is in addition to the \$1.00 per month penalty and the normal licensing fees. If you no longer have a dog(s) please contact the office so we may update our records accordingly.

As required by RSA 466:1, all dogs must be licensed each year by April 30<sup>th</sup>. For your convenience, the license(s) can be mailed for an additional fee of \$1.00 per dog along with a self addressed stamped envelope or processed on line at <u>www.eb2gov.com</u>. Fees are as follows: Unaltered: \$10.00, Spayed/Neutered: \$7.50, Puppies (3-7mos): \$7.50, over 65: \$2.00 (only 1 dog eligible).

#### CAMP COUNSELOR APPLICATIONS BEING ACCEPTED FOR CAMP FREMONT

The Fremont Parks & Recreation Commission is now accepting applications for paid summer positions at Camp Fremont! Currently we are looking to hire a <u>Sports and Games Specialist, Arts and</u> <u>Crafts/Drama Specialist, as well as Counselors</u>. Work hours could fall between 7:30 am - 5:30 pm Monday through Friday. Pay commensurate with experience.

We are also accepting applications for campers interested in our **Counselor in Training Program**. The CIT program is offered to applicants who have graduated from eighth grade or higher by the start of summer camp sessions. Our Jr. CIT program is available for students who have graduated from seventh grade or higher by the start of summer camp sessions. Jr. CITs and CITs are required to attend camp from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm for a week-long session. The CIT program is a training program. CITs will learn valuable skills that employers seek when hiring counselors. The cost for a week-long session is \$50 for Jr. CITs and \$45 for CITs.

Applicants must be dependable, adaptable, creative, and enjoy working with children; have good communication and problem solving skills, and be a positive role model for campers. All applicants must be certified in Child CPR and preferably certified in First Aid. Prior experience working with children is required.

Applicants must possess specialized skills in the following areas: special events, arts and crafts, sports, games, management of group activities, as well as, ability to connect individually with campers, behavior management, and daily event planning and implementation. Applicants will be required to pass a Criminal Background Check.

**Responsibilities Include:** Work under the supervision of the Summer Camp Director and the Parks and Recreation Commission, Identify and meet camper needs, supervise campers at all times, ensuring safety and preventing accidents; adhere to the guidelines

outlined in the Camp Manual; plan and implement daily camp activities according to the expectations set forth by the Camp Director; maintain, organize, and clean camp facilities, supplies, and equipment; perform various administrative tasks including signing in and out campers, providing before and after care, completing incident and accident forms, maintaining positive public relations with parents, and other assorted duties; carry out departmental discipline procedures, ensuring that all campers are held to high behavioral expectations; supervise and mentor Counselor in Training (CIT) participants.

Positions are appointed by the Board of Selectmen upon recommendation of the Parks & Recreation Commission.
