PUBLIC NOTICE MOSQUITO CONTROL

Town of Fremont Public Health Mosquito Control Program West Nile Virus and Eastern Equine Encephalitis

Spraying to control larval mosquitos will begin on April 20, 2016 in the Town of Fremont. Larval mosquitoes will be controlled in areas such as marshes, salt marshes, red maple swamps, woodland pools, flooded fields, roadside ditches and flooded stormwater basins. Mosquito larvae found in street and parking lot catch basins will also be controlled. With the recent advent of Zika Virus, mosquito populations will be monitored for associated vector mosquitoes.

The primary control agent will be a bacterium larvacide called Vectobac (BTI) or Vectoless (Bs). This environmentally- friendly biological control is very specific to mosquito larvae and is used worldwide in mosquito control. The bacterium is naturally occurring and will not replicate in the environment. Spraying to control larvae will continue as needed until December 15, 2016. Control agents will only be applied where larvae are collected.

Town officials may decide to complete emergency adulticide (bifenthrin) spraying to parks, athletic fields, schools, and other public areas should a public health emergency dictate.

Requests for service can be made on our website www.swamp-inc.com or by email.

Municipal Pest Management Services, Inc. will provide mosquito control services for the Town of Fremont in 2016.

UPDATE ON THE ZIKA VIRUS

As this is a concern for many given the news coverage, I'd like to address the current Zika Virus outbreak. Zika Virus is a rapidly expanding disease and will be addressed in our 2016 mosquito control program. Two mosquitoes are the primary vectors of Zika in the Caribbean, South and Central America. These mosquitoes are both found in warmer states in America and Zika will likely occur there in 2016. At present, neither mosquito has been identified in our area. However, one of them is very close to us and has been identified in New Jersey, New York and Connecticut. The Asian Tiger Mosquito (ATM), *Aedes albopictus*, will eventually inhabit our area and start to show up in our mosquito traps. It is a day biting mosquito and is found in urban and suburban areas. It flies very short distances and is capable of vectoring Zika Virus as well as West Nile Virus, Eastern Equine Encephalitis, dengue and Chikungunya. The presence of this mosquito does not necessarily mean that Zika will arrive soon after. We plan to identify, monitor and control breeding areas of ATM in each of our communities. Breeding areas include container habitats such as street catch basins, tree holes, abandoned pools, stagnant ditches, cemetery urns, clogged gutters, discarded tires and anything that can hold shallow, stagnant waters. NH LOW & MODERATE INCOME TAX RELIEF

The State has not yet released the 2015 Form DP-8 for the Low and Moderate Income Property Tax Relief. Once they do, the Selectmen's Office will mail out copies to those who have made the request. It will also be available from the Town's website and from the Selectmen's Office. The State no longer mails the forms out; so be sure to get yours. Forms must be filed by June 30, 2016.

There are also instructions that accompany the form, and that may be a separate document on the state website.

LABOR & MAINTENANCE / CLEANING POSITIONS

The Town of Fremont is seeking dedicated and energetic applicants for a couple of part-time, non-exempt general labor and maintenance position within the Town. There are approximately 15-25 hours per week total needed for all combined tasks, and they can be split between multiple people depending on availability, skill set, and individual needs of the Town and any potential applicants.

The work includes all cleaning, care and maintenance of the Town Hall and Safety Complex; exterior maintenance of the Library all seasons; and seasonal exterior maintenance at Park Facilities. Seasonal winter duties include, but are not limited to snow shoveling, operating a snowblower, maintenance for snow and ice conditions at buildings and adjacent walkways; and summer duties include, but are not limited to lawn care, mowing, trimming, tree pruning, raking, and general groundskeeping as assigned. There are other duties as assigned related to general maintenance and upkeep of town buildings, grounds, and equipment.

Ideal candidate(s) will be a true self-starter and able to work with minimal direct supervision. Must be reliable in all seasons, and able

to work a flexible schedule to meet the varying seasonal demands. Position is primarily supervised by the Town Administrator. The Town will also consider a combination of staff members with responsibilities separated by building or task.

Experience working with the public is preferred. Successful candidate will be required to submit to a complete background check. Experience in building or related trades is preferable, but a combination of experience and trade skill will be considered. Strong interpersonal or customer service skills are required. HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

The Fremont Board of Selectmen held a public hearing on April 14, 2016 as part of a regular Selectmen's Meeting. At that time, they adopted the final Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan Update 2016 and signed the document cover page for return to FEMA and NH OEM. This is a working document for the Town's Hazard Mitigation Planning purposes. FEMA requires every municipality in the country to develop a Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan to and to update their Plan every five years. The Plan is posted on the Town's website and available in the Selectmen's Office.

LIBRARY ROOF STACK REPAIR WORK

The Town of Fremont is seeking qualified contractors interested in repair work on the stacks atop the Fremont Public Library Roof. The project is best described as maintenance, repair and painting of the two stacks located at the top of the Library Roof. Roof has recently been completely replaced and the selected contractor will need to work carefully to ensure that this work is maintained and remains in pristine condition throughout the balance of the roof repairs.

Trustees can provide Sherwin Williams brand paint information to be matched.

General Information

Contractors are encouraged to see the layout of the building prior to making a proposal. All work is exterior work. Exterior of the Library building is plainly visible.

Scope of work includes:

1. Price to include all necessary materials and labor to complete job. Please break out each tower separately and price for work done individually and combined. Please provide a detailed written proposal (inventory list) for all work to be completed at the building to include at a minimum:
 - Loose paint/stain and defective caulking removed
 - Scraping and Sanding of all peeling areas
 - Surfaces to be washed free of mildew and dirt
 - Gaps between adjoining wood/trim to be properly sealed/caulked
 - Sealing and priming surfaces as required prior to finish coat (s)
 - Replaced wood to be replaced with Certain Teed Restoration PVC to match existing
2. Work is to be guaranteed for a period of (4) years. Provide written warranty.

3. Any material used on site shall be disposed of at the Contractor's expense.
4. Contractor to provide color chart to match existing color at the Fremont Public Library, with recommendation provided on paint.
5. Detail any work not included in the proposal, and a cost per unit to fix and/or replace (such as missing boards or trim that needs replacement).
6. Provide your estimated schedule to complete this work, if award is made by June 23, 2016. The Town's plan is to have all work completed prior to the winter season, or no later than November 1, 2016.
7. Contractor should suggest improvements needed based on site examination.

Please outline a detailed proposal for all work including costs for all labor and materials; and include any other information the contractor feels is pertinent to the scope of work. Detail any other items the Contractor deems as necessary. Please include three references for whom similar work has been performed.

If other trim areas need painting, please detail this work out separately. Final work plan will depend on budgeted funds and pricing to complete.

Successful Contractor will be required to provide the following to the Selectmen's Office (295 Main Street – PO Box 120) upon award: full insurance documentation, with certificates naming the Town of Fremont as an additional insured; IRS paperwork for vendors. Sealed proposals, clearly marked LIBRARY STACK REPAIR BID shall be received not later than Wednesday June 1, 2016 by 5 pm. Library Hours are Monday 12 noon to 6:00 pm; Tuesday/Thursday 1:00 to 7:00 pm; Wednesday/Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm; Saturday 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. The Town of Fremont reserve the right to accept or reject any/all bids deemed to be in the best interest of the Town of Fremont.

After the bid opening, the Bidder may not amend, correct, modify or change in any fashion, a bid, which would be contradictory to the interests of the Town of Fremont or to fair competition. The Board of Selectmen may waive minor informalities, or allow the bidder to make corrections, as long as the intent of the bid is not disturbed.

The Town of Fremont reserves the right to request additional data or information or a presentation in support of written proposals. However, the Town may award a contract based on offers received, without additional submissions. Accordingly, the proposal should be submitted on the most favorable terms from all aspects, which the Bidder can submit. The Town reserves all rights to negotiate with the contractor of its choice based not solely upon cost alone, but on the qualifications and ability of the consultant to perform, consistent with the Town's intent, requirements, time schedule, and funds availability.

The following non-collusion clause shall be part of every bid specification package. Bidders must sign this statement in order for the bid to be valid:

"The undersigned certified under penalties of perjury that this bid is in all respects bona fide, fair and made without collusion or fraud with any other person. As use in this section the word "person" means any natural person, joint venture, partnership, corporation or other business or legal entity."

All contractors shall be aware of and follow as necessary, the Town's policies, available on the Town's website at www.Fremont.nh.gov on the Board of Selectmen's page. Submittal of a proposal considers that the contractor has reviewed and understands all applicable policies.

ROADS & THE RIGHT-OF-WAY

Obstructions in the Town's right-of-way are not permitted. Plantings, mulch, trees, rocks, and decorative pavers ARE NOT PERMITTED. These structures of any size obstruct drainage from the roadway and cause other road problems. The high amounts of winter snow will cause added drainage and runoff issues this spring. Please help keep the ROW area clear.

RSA 236:15 states that any building, structure or fence within or over any highway is a public nuisance. Please do not place any such items in the right-of-way as they are subject to being removed by the Highway Department. In general, the Town right of way is 13 feet on either edge of the paved surface. If you have any questions, please contact Road Agent Leon Holmes Jr at 300 7430.

What does the Assistant Moderator do?

FIRE PERMITS REQUIRED

As you may have seen in the news, the Spring 2016 forest fire season has already started, much earlier than normal, and with a far higher than normal incidence of Class 4 and Red Flag Warning Fire Danger days. Fires are raging across the country. Please remember these simple rules:

Every person, firm or corporation who kindles or causes to be kindled, any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material in or near the woodlands, except when the ground is covered with

snow where you are burning **SHALL** obtain a written fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden in the town or city where the fire will be kindled, pursuant to NH RSA 227-L:17, I and II.

CAMPFIRE PERMITS

Camp or cooking fires may be kindled only with written permission of the landowner or agent and a written fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden. A camp or cooking fire is a suitable fire in a suitable place for the purpose of cooking a meal. A gas grill or charcoal fire in a container up and off the ground kindled by the landowner, or with landowner permission does not require a written fire permit.

Contact the Fremont Fire Department to renew your seasonal camp fire permit. This needs to be done on an annual basis.

CHIMINEA BURNING DEVICES

Chiminea devices do fall under the jurisdiction of the Forest Fire Warden. In order to use these devices, you must obtain a written permit from the Warden every time you use it. The reason for this is that the units do not meet criteria to be considered an "enclosed" device, and as such are subject to the rules of open burning.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

A written fire permit shall be **SUMMARILY SUSPENDED** if any of the following fire permit restrictions are violated, and an Official Notice of Summons shall be issued:

- ❖ If a fire is kindled or material is burned between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm unless actually raining.
- ❖ If a fire is kindled or material is burned at an unspecified date, time, place, or if material not specified on the written permit is burned.
- ❖ If a fire is kindled or material is burned when weather is unfavorable in the opinion of the issuing authority or proclamation closing the woodlands is in force.
- ❖ If a fire is kindled or material is burned when specified assistance or suppression equipment is not present to control the fire.
- ❖ If permittee fails to keep the fire under control, or if the Director, Division of Forests and Lands, or his authorized agents or Warden feel that the material being burned is causing a hazard endangering life and/or property.
- ❖ If material being burned violates any state law, rule, or regulation or local ordinance and or New Hampshire Air Resources Division regulation regarding open burning.

OTHER REGULATIONS

- ◇ All open fires shall be constantly attended until the fire is completely extinguished.
- ◇ Fires kindled and material burned shall be not less than 50 feet from any structure and provisions shall be made to prevent a fire from spreading to within 50 feet of any structure. Fires in approved containers shall be not less than 25 feet from any structure.
- ◇ You must be 18 years of age to obtain a written fire permit.
- ◇ You also must be the landowner to obtain a permit. If you are not, written permission from the landowner must be submitted to the Fire Department. This permission must clearly state the dates the owner is permitting burning (and it can be done for the "season"), who they are giving permission to, and their name, address, and contact telephone number.

**Be sure your fire is completely and totally extinguished.
A buried fire is not an extinguished fire!**

If you have questions, please contact the Fremont Forest Fire Warden Richard Butler through the Fire Station at 895 9634 or by calling Raymond Dispatch at 895 4222. The Fire Chief/Forest Fire Warden has office hours on Monday and Thursday evenings from

5:00 to 7:00 pm, and you can call Dispatch or the Station at any time for more information.

In Fremont, burn permits are only issued in the evening, weather conditions permitting. Call the above phone numbers for more information day to day.

The class day is depicted on the Smokey Bear sign in front of the Safety Complex Station at 425 Main Street. In general, when the fire danger is at 3 or above, no permits are issued for outdoor burning. It is solely at the discretion of the Warden on a daily basis, depending on the weather conditions.

GET YOUR DOG LICENSED!

2016 dog licenses are due by April 30th. Get is done as soon as possible as fines will be instituted shortly. A current rabies certificate is required for licensing your dog(s) as the Clerk's Office is required by law to retain a copy of the vaccination certificate. Please call the office to inquire if the rabies certificate on file is still valid. You must license your dog(s) by April 30th to prevent the initiation of a late penalty of \$1.00 per month. As required by RSA 466:1, all dogs must be licensed each year by April 30th.
