NH LOW & MODERATE INCOME TAX RELIEF

The State's 2021 Form DP-8 for the Low-and Moderate-Income Property Tax Relief is now available. If you need a form, you can pick it up at the Select Board's Office or use the web fill-in form and print it. It will also be available as a link from the Town's website now that it has been posted by the NH DRA. The State no longer mails the forms out, so be sure to get yours and file it no later than June 30, 2022.

Contact the Select Board's Office at 603 895 2226 to have one mailed out to you, or check the State website at: http://revenue.nh.gov/forms/low-moderate.htm to fill out and print your form online. From that page, you will need to get Form DP-8 for the 2021 tax year.

A current rabies certificate is required, please email the Clerk's Office to inquire if the rabies certificate on file is still valid. If you have not already registered your dog(s) please license them ASAP to avoid additional fines and penalties. You must also add a late penalty of \$1.00 per month beginning June 1.

For your convenience, the license(s) can be mailed for an additional fee of \$1.00 per license, or you can relicense your dog(s) online by going to the Town Clerk page on the Town's website at www.fremont.nh.gov and select E-Dog.

2022 FIRST ISSUE TAX BILLS

Tax bills are begin prepared and will be mailed out shortly. First issue bills will be due July 1, 2022 to the Tax Collector. Payments can always be dropped off in the drop box or mailed in and are processed daily. You can stop by during normal office hours if you want your receipt immediately or are paying cash.

Tax Collector office hours are Monday (through June 27) from 9:00 am to 12 noon; Tuesday 7:30 am to 3:00 pm; Wednesday 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm; Thursday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm; Friday 9:00 am to 12 noon. The Town Clerk Tax Collector's Office is CLOSED on Mondays for the summer, beginning July 4th.

ROADS & THE RIGHT-OF-WAY

Obstructions in the Town's right-of-way are not permitted. Plantings, mulch, trees, rocks, and decorative pavers ARE NOT PERMITTED. These structures of any size obstruct drainage from the roadway and cause other road problems. The high amounts of winter snow will cause added drainage and runoff issues this spring. Please help keep the ROW area clear.

RSA 236:15 states that any building, structure or fence within or over any highway is a public nuisance. Please do not place any such items in the right-of-way as they are subject to being removed by the Highway Department. In general, the Town right of way is 13 feet on either edge of the paved surface. If you have any questions, please contact Road Agent Leon Holmes Jr at 300 7430.

OPEN SPACE REPORT UPDATED!

The Fremont Open Space Report was first written in 2010 and the town has changed a lot since then. This report includes items like identifying critical resources, including water and wetlands, habitats, wildlife corridors, agricultural land and existing open space and undeveloped land in Fremont. This Open Space Report reflects the current state of open space in Fremont and makes recommendations that can be used to guide the town for planning now and in the future. This is a great resource to learn about Fremont.

The updated Open Space Plan is now available online. Lots of great maps, tables and analysis are included in this very robust document prepared by the Open Space Task Force.

bags, and cereal bags can be recycled at the Town Hall. All materials must be clean, dry and free of food residue.



FULL-TIME BUILDINGS & GROUNDS MAINTENANCE POSITION

The Town of Fremont is seeking dedicated and energetic, self-starting applicants for a new full-time position to cover a wide variety of buildings and grounds cleaning, maintenance and care. This is a non-exempt 40-hour position. Work schedule is generally Monday through Friday but with all-weather responsibilities, schedule will be shifted as needed for conditions and will include some nights and weekends. The Town is seeking a varied skill set and is looking to match the right individual and attitude with the needs of the Town.

The work includes all cleaning, care, repair and general maintenance of the Town Hall and Safety Complex; some maintenance of the library all seasons; and other times as needed at cemeteries, parks and other facilities. Seasonal winter duties include, but are not limited to snow shoveling, operating a snowblower, maintenance for snow and ice conditions at buildings and adjacent walkways; and summer duties include, but are not limited to lawn care, mowing, trimming, tree pruning, raking, and general groundskeeping as assigned. There are other duties as assigned related to general maintenance and upkeep of town buildings, grounds, and equipment. This includes setup for Town seasonal events (voting, Memorial Day services, Veterans events, etc).

Ideal candidate will be a true self-starter and able to work with minimal direct supervision. Must be reliable in all seasons, and able to work a flexible schedule to meet the varying seasonal demands. Position will be supervised by a Maintenance Coordinator and the Town Administrator.

Experience working with the public is preferred. Successful candidate will be required to submit to a complete background check. Experience in building or related trades is preferable, but a combination of experience and trade skill will be considered. Strong interpersonal or customer service skills are required. The Town has a competitive benefits package and wage range budgeted at \$20 per hour. MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM



The 2022 mosquito control season is off to a slow but potentially interesting start. So far, very few larvae have been found in Fremont's wetlands until now. In early April, the cold nights kept mosquito larvae populations down. We got rain in April that

will provide more breeding habitats than in 2021. Recently we began to find early instar larvae in the secluded wetland pools. These were growing very slowly due to very cold surface water and are unlikely to be fully grown and flying until mid-May. The control permit has been approved now and treatment of these areas and surveillance of others will begin.

Household Mosquito Breeding Locations

Did you know there are plenty of household mosquito breeding sites? Mosquitoes will lay eggs in containers that hold water for a week, even as little as an inch! Be sure to dump out standing water to prevent mosquito breeding at home! Common sources of stagnant water include:

- Bird Baths
- Ornamental Ponds
- Flowerpots, Planters and Watering Cans
- Clogged Gutters and Downspouts
- Wheelbarrows
- Buckets and Tarps
- Tires, Bottles, Cans and other Solid Waste
- Garbage Cans and Recycle Bins

- Kiddie Pools, Toys, and Sandboxes
- Boats, Kayaks, Canoes and Jet skis
- Untreated Pools and Pool Covers
- Be sure to check for pooling water near Gutter Downspouts, Outdoor Faucets and Hoses, AC Units, Swimming Pool Pumps, and Sump Pumps.

Treatment will depend on surveillance data, weather conditions and precipitation. Surveillance and treatment will continue through November 2022.

Residents requesting a survey of mosquito breeding on their property can do so at https://www.northeastvmc.com/resident-request.

In the event of detection of Eastern Equine Encephalitis, West Nile Virus, or other arboviruses in mosquito populations, emergency adulticiding may be performed at schools, parks, and recreation areas. This will be determined by surveillance data, and in consultation with Town officials and NH DHHS.

Mosquito Protection Tips

You can protect yourself from mosquito bites and reduce your risk of mosquito borne disease with a few simple preventative measures. See more at

https://www.cdc.gov/easternequineencephalitis/gen/pre.html

- Avoid outdoor activity at dusk and dawn, when mosquitoes are most active.
- Always wear DEET or other FDA recommended bug repellants. Clothing and camping gear can also be treated for long term protections. See the CDC guide for choosing a repellant here. https://www.epa.gov/insect-repellents
- Use mosquito netting to cover strollers and carriers to prevent bites on infants.
- Wear long sleeve clothing, especially when outdoors at dusk and dawn.
- Repair window screens and avoid leaving doors open to prevent mosquitoes from entering your home.
- Keep lawns mowed and perimeter brush cut short to reduce mosquito resting areas.
- Empty sources of stagnant water around your home.
