The Fremont Supervisors of the Checklist will meet Tuesday June 7, 2011, from 7:00 to 7:30 pm. The meeting will be held at the Fremont Public Library.

The meeting is being held pursuant to NH RSA 654:39 (Verification Every 10 Years). The purpose of the meeting is to review the checklist and strike there from the names of all persons who have not registered or reregistered.

For the purpose of this meeting, a person shall be deemed reregistered and need not appear before the supervisors if:

(a) The person voted in any election within the 4 years immediately preceding a 10-year verification; or

(b) The person has been added to the checklist since the last state general election.

In case of rain, the concert will be held in the Community Room. This fun-filled, family oriented event is free and open to all Fremont residents. As you may already know, the Summer Reading Program is a National program established to encourage school-aged children to read over the Summer. Research has consistently shown that a child who reads during these months, even 1 book!, performs better when school resumes in the fall. Reading gets better the more a child practices, as does comprehension, spelling and writing.

All children, regardless of age or skill level, are encouraged to join the program. "Miss Lynda" has found over the years that younger brothers and sisters are as eager and enthusiastic as their older siblings! And children who struggle with reading are encouraged with their progress, as they explore books on their own and often in different formats, such as graphic novels or books with movie tie-ins.

Children who register for the Summer Reading Program at Fremont Library are invited to read, maintain a reading log and play the Game Sheet in order to earn small prizes in the Library "Store."

FREMONT BALLFIELDS SECURITY

Dear Residents and Taxpayers,

THE GATES AT THE BALLFIELDS ARE LOCKED! WHY? The ballfield gates are locked because we continue to have a high rate of vandalism and the last one was probably the worst. This costs money to repair. The Recreation Commission does not have a budget that these items can continue to be repaired indefinitely.

Every dollar we spend repairing vandalism is a dollar that could have been used to improve some aspect of the recreational areas. Not that long ago we had 2 dusty, dry fields that we played ball on. Those fields were rough but many people worked to make them playable and any attempt at damage was cut short by a watching parent or coach. Everyone had a vested interest. Now we have excellent ballfields and play areas and it seems like nobody sees anything ever.

As time went by we saw how inconvenient it was for people to access the fields and there really was not any significant damage being done. I fought to have the fields open all the time because I wanted residents to be able to go up whenever they wanted.

I have no intention of patrolling the ballfields or asking the police to do so. They are your fields, take some ownership for them. Pick up the trash, tell the kids to get off the cages, call the police when you see something, I don't know, pretend it's your property. I am speaking for myself and as a member of the Fremont Recreation Department. If you want to help me give me a call.

TOWN CLERK NEWS DOG LICENSES ARE NOW OVERDUE

The deadline for licensing your dog(s) for 2011 was April 30th. A late penalty of \$1.00 per month per dog will now be assessed to your licensing fee. A current rabies vaccination is required for licensing, as the Clerk's Office is required to retain a copy of the vaccination certificate. If you no longer have a dog(s) please contact the office so your name can be removed from the list. As required by RSA 466:1, every owner or keeper of a dog 4 months old or over must obtain a license for each dog(s) by April 30 annually. For your convenience, the license(s) can be mailed for an additional fee of \$1.00 per dog along with a self addressed stamped envelope. Fees are as follows: Unaltered: \$10.00, Spayed/Neutered: \$7.50, Puppies (3-7 mos): \$7.50, over 65: \$2.00, please add the \$1.00 late fee to the prices listed. You may also license on-line with "E-dog," located on the Clerk's page on the Town's website at Fremont.nh.gov. As of June 16th any unlicensed dog(s) will be subject to a civil forfeiture fee of \$25.00 per dog in accordance with RSA 466:13. The forfeiture fee is in addition to the \$1.00 per month penalty and the normal licensing fees.

NEW OFFICE HOURS

Effective July 1, 2011 the Town Clerk's office will have <u>new office hours</u>. Open office hours will be: Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday 8:00 am to 3:00 pm, Thursday 10:00 am to 7:00 pm, and Friday CLOSED. Please feel free to call the office with questions or concerns at 895 8693.

VITAL RECORDS UPDATE

Prior to visiting the Town Clerk's office, please call (895-8693) if you require a certified copy of a Vital Record or a Marriage License. Also, anyone who has been appointed to a committee or board who needs to be "sworn in" is asked to call in advance. Your call will insure that the Clerk is available to assist you. The Town Clerk is the only person in the office authorized to issue a Vital Record, a Marriage License or prescribe the Oath of Office at the present time.

REGISTRATION RENEWALS

When renewing your vehicle registration or boat registration in person, you **MUST** provide the Clerk's office with the current registration or the renewal notice that you received in the mail. This is a State law. If you do not provide either of these documents, the Clerk's office **CANNOT** process the registration renewal without first printing a certified copy of the previous registration at a cost of \$18.00.

BOAT REGISTRATIONS

The boating season is quickly approaching. To better serve you, the Town Clerk's Office can provide boat registrations & decals for both renewals and for new boats. Please be sure to have the correct paperwork with you. Please call the office at 895-8693 with questions.
