NH LOW & MODERATE INCOME TAX RELIEF

The State's 2022 Form DP-8 for the Low- and Moderate-Income Property Tax Relief are available on the Town's website or for pick up at the Select Board's Office.

REMEMBER TO FILE your form by June 30, 2023.

FIRST ISSUE TAX BILLS

Tax bills for first issue 2023 are in the mail. Bills are due July 1, 2023 to the Tax Collector. Payments can always be dropped off in the drop box or mailed in. You can also stop by during normal office hours if you want your receipt immediately or are paying cash.

Tax Collector hours are Monday (through June 26) from 9:00 am to 12 noon; Tuesday 8:00 am to 12:00 noon; Wednesday 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm; Thursday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm; Friday 9:00 am to 12 noon.

The Collector will have SPECIAL hours on SATURDAY JULY 1 from 7:30 to 10:00 am to pay on the final day.

GRILLING SAFELY

Follow these simple rules to grill safely!

- Grills should be used in accordance with the manufacturer's listing.
- Keep loose clothing away from the cooking surface and beware of grease flare-ups.
- Check the hose on your gas grill for cracks and deterioration.
- Check your connections to the gas tank for leaks by applying a soap and water solution. If you see bubbles shut off the gas, clean and check for tightness; and recheck again.
- Clean venturi tubes and grill burners to allow an efficient mixture of gas and even heating.
- Use of gas grills, where permitted, shall be at least three feet from any combustibles, such as your house, porch railings, etc.
- The grill shall never be used under any overhand of the building, including the garage, breezeway, carport or porch.

The Heretic's Daughter by Kathleen Kent


Salem, 1752. Sarah Carrier Chapman, weak with infirmity, writes a letter to her granddaughter that reveals the secret she has closely guarded for six



GLEN OAKES EXPANSION PROJECT

On Sunday June 11, 2023, Conservation Commissioners (and avid Open Space enthusiasts) Rich Cooper and Bill Knee put the Moose Plate Sign in the Glen Oakes Trail Kiosk. The Town was

pleased to recently acquire the 24-acre parcel 04-077 located off Copp Drive to expand the Glen Oakes Town Forest and Conservation Area. This parcel has long been on the radar of our Conservation and Open Space groups for its documented wildlife, natural resources and source water protection. Recently



the property became available for sale and the conservation-minded owners worked closely with the Town to make the sale happen.

The project, termed the "Glen Oakes Expansion" was funded by a

grant from the NH State Conservation Committee Conservation Moose Plate Grant Program (\$30,000) and a grant from the Fields Pond Foundation (\$10,000). The balance of the purchase price came from

Town Conservation Funds generated through Land Use Change Tax. These funds are comprised of a portion of the penalties paid by owners when land is removed from Current Use.

Check with the Clerk for the total amount due before sending in or dropping off your license fees/fines in the drop box. MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

Beginning in April, crews from Northeast Vegetation and Mosquito Control are undertaking mosquito control applications as needed. Sites include wetlands, marshes, drainage ditches, catch basins and floodwater areas. When found, crews will apply larvicides to control mosquito larvae. Larvicides used include:

Cocobear (Coconut & Mineral Oil) - EPA Reg. 8329-93 BVA-2 (Mineral Oil) - EPA Reg. 70589-1 Vectolex FG (Bacillus sphericus) - EPA Reg. 73049-20 Vectolex WSP (Bacillus sphericus) - EPA Reg. 73049-20 Vectobac G (Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis) - EPA Reg. 73049-10 Altosid P35 (Methoprene) - EPA Reg. 89459-95 Natular G (Spinosad) - EPA Reg. 8329-80

Treatment will depend on surveillance data, weather conditions and precipitation. Surveillance and treatment will continue through November 2022. All residents requesting no treatment on their property can do so in writing to Northeast Vegetation and Mosquito Control, 326 Main Street, Unit 12 Fremont, NH 03044 or online at https://www.northeastvmc.com/no-spray.

Residents requesting a survey of mosquito breeding on their property can do so at https://www.northeastvmc.com/resident-request.

In the event of detection of Eastern Equine Encephalitis, West Nile Virus, or other arboviruses in mosquito populations, emergency adulticiding may be performed at schools, parks, and recreation areas. This will be determined by surveillance data, and in consultation with Town officials and NH DHHS.

FREMONT'S JUST IN CASE PROGRAM

The Just in Case Program is a comprehensive town-wide registry of patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and other dementia-related disorders. As its name might suggest, the Just in Case Program functions as an emergency tool in the event that an individual wanders and becomes lost or disoriented. Fremont Police officials may then refer to the Just in Case database for easy identification in order to provide a quick and safe return of that individual.

This program is also used to identify people in our community living with mental or physical disabilities. Registration in this program alerts the police to a person's diagnosis and emergency contact, as well as what both calms and triggers the individual, so police officers can better respond to a person's individualized needs during an encounter.

How to register

Family, friends, and caregivers interested in registering someone in the *Just In Case* program with the Fremont Police Department may do so by downloading the *Just In Case* registration form at the Fremont Police Department website located

at https://www.fremont.nh.gov/police-department/pages/forms, filling it out and emailing it to rbarbosa@fremontnhpd.com.

You can also mail the physical form to the Fremont Police Department at 425 Main Street Fremont, NH 03044 or drop it off in person at the same address. We would encourage providing a photo in the email or a physical photo along with the form if it is mailed or dropped off. Including the photo, like the rest of the form and program is completely voluntary and optional.

ARE YOU BEHIND IN PAYING YOUR MORTGAGE, PROPERTY CHARGES, OR UTILITIES BECAUSE OF COVID-19?

The NH Homeowner Assistance Fund provides assistance to eligible residents who are past due in paying their home mortgage, property taxes, home insurance, association fees, or utilities due to Covid-19 pandemic. Apply at www.HomeHelpNH.org.

ELIGIBLE HOMEOWNERS

- Must have experienced a COVID-19 pandemic related reduction in income or increase in expenses that occurred after January 21, 2020 or began prior to but continued after that date.
- Must own and occupy, as their primary residence, the New Hampshire property for which assistance is requested.
- Must have income (s) of equal to or less than 125% of Area Median Income.

ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES: Must be owner-occupied or in the case of a land contract or contract for deed, occupied by the documented buyer. Eligible properties include:

- A single-family (attached or detached) properties
- Condominium units
- 1–4-unit properties where one of the units is the homeowner's primary residence
- Manufactured/modular homes permanently affixed to rest property and taxed as real estate
- Manufactured homes not permanently affixed to real property but with a Title Certificate or Statement of Ownership in the homeowner's name
