GET YOUR DOG LICENSED!

2014 dog licenses were due by April 30th. A current rabies certificate is required for licensing your dog(s) as the Clerk's Office is required by law to retain a copy of the vaccination certificate. Please call the office to inquire if the rabies certificate on file is still valid. There is a late penalty in place as of May 1st, and after June 20th you will be subject to the \$25 fine.

As required by RSA 466:1, all dogs must be licensed each year by April 30th. For your convenience, the license(s) can be mailed for an additional fee of \$1.00 per license, or you can license your dog(s) online by going to the Town Clerk page on the Town's website at www.Fremont.nh.gov and click E-Dog. If you no longer have your dog, please contact the Clerk's office at 895 8693 so we can update our records accordingly.

SIGN UP FOR THE NEWSLETTER TO BE DELIVERED TO YOUR INBOX!

The Fremont Newsletter is only mailed a couple of times per year, but it is still published on a monthly basis. Sign up to receive notification so that you don't miss any issues!

To sign up for the electronic notification of the Newsletter, follow these steps:

1. Click on "Subscribe to E-Alerts" from the home page (left side navigation bar) of the Town's website at www.Fremont.nh.gov.
2. Click on "Add my name to a list"
3. Enter your email address
4. Check off boxes of all material you want to receive. Be sure to include "Town Newsletter" to get the monthly newsletter.
5. Hit "send my request"
6. You will get an email back from the web hosting site that you **MUST REPLY TO** in order that your email address is added to the distribution list.
7. Once you complete all of these steps, you will get an email each time one of the items is posted to the website. When you click on the link in your email, it will take you directly to the Newsletter, or other news item you have subscribed to.

You can also subscribe to TOWN NEWS and you will be notified when any new information is posted to the homepage of the website or emergency news is posted. This includes unanticipated office closures, changes to office hours, some events, and news updates.

You can unsubscribe at any time using the same process, and choosing "Remove my name."

NEW VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

When registering a vehicle that is less than 15 years old, you must provide either of the following: the title, signed by the previous owner or the title application that the dealer gave you. If you have the title, all owners **MUST** be present when registering, with their valid ID, to sign the title application. If you have the title application, anyone can register your vehicle for you, on your behalf, however they must present their ID.

TRANSFER OF PLATES

If you are transferring plates from your old vehicle to another one you **MUST** turn in the current registration for the old vehicle. This has to be sent to the state with the transfer documentation. Failure to have this document in hand will require you to purchase a duplicate at a cost of \$18.00.

Please note: **PLATES CAN ONLY BE TRANSFERRED FROM ONE VEHICLE TO ANOTHER IF THE PRIMARY OWNER REMAINS THE SAME.**

MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION RENEWAL & DOG LICENSING RENEWAL AVAILABLE ON-LINE!



Internet transactions will be accepted through a kiosk to renew your motor vehicle registrations and renew your dog licenses from your computer at home. Customers will be directed to a secure web site through the kiosk. The Town of Fremont will receive all applicable fees and there is no charge to the Town for the electronic payment. Customers are charged a convenience fee for the transaction.

All inquiries are directed through our software provider's website and there is no direct access to the Town's computers or their systems.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION RENEWALS

When renewing your vehicle registration or boat registration in person, you **MUST** provide the Clerk's office with the current registration or the "courtesy" renewal notice that you received in the mail. This is a State law.

ID FOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

When registering a vehicle with the Town Clerk's office you **MUST** present a valid photo id or driver's license in order for your transaction to be completed. This requirement has been issued by the NH Department of Safety – Fraud Unit.

CAMP FREMONT SUMMER PROGRAM

The Camp Fremont Summer Program is still accepting registrations for six week-long camp sessions. Camp Fremont is a safe environment where your child can develop emotionally, socially, and physically for the summer. With a low camper-to-counselor ratio, your child will receive lots of individual attention. Campers will participate in a variety of physical and arts & crafts activities, as well as attend field trips and be entertained by educational presenters. Each session will be offered according to an overall theme which will ensure that you are signing your child up for activities that they will

enjoy. Field trips costs and a free Camp Fremont t-shirt are included in the tuition costs. Come see how much fun Camp Fremont can be!

Who: Students graduating from grades 1-8.

When: Monday- Friday; 9:00 am - 3:00 pm

Cost: \$100.00 per week (includes the cost of field trips)

\$85.00 for the second child per family; \$45.00 per week for additional children per family (3+). See the full fee schedule and application package on the Town's website or the Selectmen's Office at the Town Hall.

Checks can be made payable to TOWN OF FREMONT.

Returned checks are subject to a \$25 fee, and only cash or certified funds can be accepted for future payments. REGISTER as soon as possible to secure your spot in the Camp Fremont Program.

Tentatively, the following sessions are being offered

Week 1: July 7 - 11 Bon Voyage Week - Time to sail into summer and explore the world? We will be doing country-themed activities and bringing in some Wildlife Encounters to Fremont.

Week 2: July 14 - 18 Trains, Planes, Automobiles Week - It's a bird! It's a plane! It's CAMP FREMONT! We will be navigating through several transportation-themed activities

Week 3: July 21 - 25 Wet and Wild - need to beat the heat? This week is all about water balloons and aquatic games. On Friday, Campers can bring water guns for water wars!

Week 4 July 28 - August 1 Pirates Week - We will be releasing our inner pirate and uncovering some hidden treasures both near and far!

Week 5: August 4 - 8 Olympics Week - Camp Fremont is the site of this year's Summer Olympics! Campers will work together with their Olympic teams to compete for the Bronze, Silver and Gold.

Week 6: August 11 - 15 Kooky Carnival Week This year, we will be taking inspiration from theme parks to create our own Kooky Carnival to celebrate our fun times that we have had this summer.

All trips and camp activities are weather/funding dependent. If a trip or local camp activity has to be cancelled on the day of the event as a result of insufficient funding or inclement weather, the trip may or may not be rescheduled for later in that week or during the camp season.

We are also offering before and after care for an additional fee. During this time, your child will be supervised but will not be led in structured activities.
