FREMONT REVALUATION 2015

The Appraisal Firm of Vision Government Solutions is currently completing the Town's 2015 Revaluation Project. The following is a general outline and explanation of each phase of the project.

Vision Government Solutions will be working with the Selectmen/Assessor's Office to make the process a successful one. There are four major phases to a municipal revaluation that are being utilized: Market Analysis, Valuation, Field Review, and Informal Hearings.

PHASE 1: MARKET ANALYSIS

A variety of resources are used to analyze the real estate market. Appraisal personnel will be analyzing recent sales that took place over the last few years to determine which market factors influenced property values. Vision Government Solution's personnel visit all properties that have sold in the last 2 years. They will measure the exterior of all buildings and perform an interior inspection. Vision Government Solutions will also gather and use information from The Registry of Deeds, property managers, developers, and local real estate professionals. Once all the data is collected and reviewed for accuracy, the appraiser will determine land values and set neighborhood codes that rate the desirability of locations throughout the Town. Sales data collection and analysis will take place from mid-March through early June.

In late March, letters went out to commercial property owners to include any commercial/industrial uses as well as apartments. Vision is collection information on market rents and other cost factors to help determine value. Your input to this process as an owner is very important.

PHASE 2: VALUATION

Valuation is done using one of the three recognized methods: Replacement/Market Cost, Income Approach and Sales Comparison Approach. The Sales Comparison is the most widely used approach, and most easily explained to the taxpayer. During this phase, individual characteristics of the building are analyzed using information gathered in phase 1. Each property is compared to other comparable properties with similar characteristics. Then the market values of the improvements are added to the land value that was previously determined. This value is the final estimate for each parcel of property, building and land. This process will take place from late April through June.

PHASE 3: FIELD REVIEW

Field Review is the method of checking and re-checking both the values that have been determined and the data. During this review, properties are viewed in the field by experienced appraisers who double-check for uniformity and accuracy of information. This process will take place in June and July.

PHASE 4: INFORMAL HEARINGS

Once the Field Review is completed, a Notice of New Values will be mailed to each property owner. At this time, anyone with questions concerning the revaluation process or about the data on their property has an opportunity to meet with a member of Vision's staff to discuss their property value. This will take place in early August. Please watch for the letter to arrive with information about your property value, and the dates for the informal reviews. It is important that if you have questions about the information that you schedule a review while the Vision Appraisers are in town.

The State of NH Department of Revenue Administration monitors all phases of the Town's revaluation process and may also be in the field doing inspections and verifying data. Some homeowners will receive postcards announcing a visit by a State Appraiser as well, and other random drive-by or personal inspections on renovations, building permits, and sale properties may also take place. Any assessor from the NH DRA office will be in a marked State of NH car

and will have State Identification.

After all four phases are completed, all data, files, records, etc. used in the revaluation are then turned over to the Assessor's Office. This will allow the Town to maintain the data collected during the revaluation on a continual basis. The

NH NEW HANDS FREE ELECTRONIC DEVICE LAW

Effective July 1, 2015

What does this mean?

- No use of hand held electronic devices capable of providing voice or data communication while driving or temporarily halted in traffic for a stop sign or traffic signal or other momentary delays.
- This includes cell phones, GPS, tablets, iPods, iPads or other devices that require data entry.
- Emergency calls to 911 or other public safety agencies will be allowed.
- One hand non-cellular 2-way radio use will be allowed.
- Teen drivers under the age of 18 will not be allowed to use any electronic devices (hand held or not) except to report an emergency. Anyone violating this will be subject to penalties and license suspension or revocation.
- Blue tooth or other hands-free electronic devices will be allowed.
- If your vehicle is not equipped with Bluetooth functionally, auto service centers can install after-market systems or over the ear devices can be purchased at retailers such as Staples, Best Buy or your cell phone carrier

Penalties for Violations

1 st Offense	\$100 fine
2 nd Offense	\$250 fine
3 rd Offense within 2 years	\$500 fine
Penalty assessments will be a	dded to the fines

Why is the NH Law Important?

- During the past 4 years, 116 fatal crashes in NH were caused by distraction.
- While texting, a driver is 23 times more likely to crash.
- Sending or receiving a text distracts the driver for almost 5 seconds.
- At 50 miles per house, we travel longer than the length of a football field during that 5 seconds.
- Even dialing a phone number increases the risk of crashing by 3 times

VOLUNTEER POSITION OPENING BUDGET COMMITTEE MEMBER

There is one remaining vacancy for a year long, volunteer, appointed position on the Fremont Budget Committee, through the March 2016 Town Meeting. In general, the position requires attendance at 12-16 evening meetings per year, busiest during the budget season between August and January annually; and quarterly the rest of the year.

The Fremont Budget Committee is accepting letters of interest through August 19, 2015 which is the date of their next meeting. Any Fremont resident who may have knowledge in financial matters or interest in such a position is encouraged to submit a letter of interest. A desire to serve the community and an interest in finances and budgetary matters of the Town and School District are a must. You must also be a registered voter in Fremont.

Following the completion of this term in March, the positions return to elected terms of varying lengths, as of March 2016. APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES FOR COMMISSIONER REPRESENTATIVE TO THE ROCKINGHAM PLANNING COMMISSION INTERESTED PERSONS SOUGHT

The Town of Fremont is seeking individuals interested in becoming Town Representatives to the Rockingham Planning Commission. As governed by RSA 36:46-III; Commissioners are appointed by Selectmen for four year terms (except when more than one position is filled at once in which case the terms are staggered).

The Planning Board nominates a representative commissioner for consideration by the Selectmen and the Selectmen make the appointment. The Planning Commission is then informed in writing by the Selectmen of the appointment. The date of appointment, name, address, telephone number and e-mail address of the newly appointed commissioner should be included in the notification letter.

YOUR JOB AS A COMISSIONER

Just what is your role as a regional planning commissioner?

It is twofold: 1) to govern the Commission through decision-making and policy setting, with the staff carrying out your decisions; and 2) to communicate regularly between the Commission and the town or city you represent so that the town is aware of Commission activities and the Commission is aware of local issues and concerns. What kinds of decision of Commissioners make?

- You decide on the nature and scope of the Commission's regional and local work programs.
- You decide on the Commission's annual operating budgetthe monies to be spent to support the work activities outlined in the work program.
- You decide what the Commission's policies will be in specific areas like natural resources, land use, local technical assistance, water resources, housing, transportation, recreation and open space. The polices in turn govern the work effort.
- You decide whether the Commission participates in proposed new projects.
- You approve salary levels for the Commission staff.
- You represent the interests of the community that appointed you at Commission meetings. You carry back to your community news of Commission activities and relay your community's concerns and desires to the Commission.
- You review staff-produced plans and reports and ask for revisions or additional staff work.
- You set policy for and determine Commission administrative and personnel procedures.

When do you participate in the decision-making?

At monthly Commission meetings. Commission meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month at the Commission's office and at locations that rotate to different communities in the region. (There are usually no meetings in August and December). In addition, an Executive Committee meets monthly and is empowered to make decisions about the operation of the Commission within the prescribed limited outlined in the by-laws. Some Commission meetings (about four per year) are also designated as MPO Policy meetings at which non-member towns and certain state and federal agencies involved with transportation are included in the decision making.

RESTORATION OF INVOLUNTARILY MERGED LOTS

In accordance with NH RSA 674:39-aa, any owner of lots merged by municipal action for zoning, assessing, or taxation purposes prior to September 18, 2010 and without the consent of the owner may request that the lots be restored to their premerger status.

Application for Restoration of Involuntarily Merged Lots Pursuant to RSA 674:39-aa can be found at the Fremont Town Hall and on the Town web site. The application must be completed and returned to the Board of Selectmen prior to December 31, 2016. Instructions and general information for lot restoration are included in the application form.
