HISTORIC 1802 TOWN POUND RECONSTRUCTION

Members of the Fremont 250th Anniversary Committee and any interested residents of the Town are welcome to come help reconstruct the Historic 1802 Poplin (now Fremont) Town Pound next to the 1800 Meetinghouse on Saturday, September 17th starting at 8:30a.m. This will be heavy work and volunteers who assist with this project must do so at their own risk. Donations of food and drink provided at lunch time would be very much appreciated by the volunteers as they strive to rebuild this once important agricultural relic of Fremont's past. This Town Pound will be a lasting legacy gift from the Fremont 250th Anniversary Committee in honor of Fremont's upcoming 250th Anniversary Celebration in 2014.

Town Pounds were usually 3 or 4 feet high granite stone-walled enclosures with an attached gate used in nearly every New England community during the 18th & 19th centuries. There purpose was to temporarily confine stray livestock that might wreck havoc in family gardens throughout the town causing families to lose important food crops that would otherwise help families survive through the cold winter months long before there were local supermarkets. Each town had an elected Poundkeeper whose job was to round up stray livestock like horses, oxen, cows, goats, hogs and sheep and bring them to the town pound where they would be cared for until the owner of the animal came to claim back his property which was identified by a unique branding mark that each local family had. The owner had to pay a fine of which half of the fine would go to the poundkeeper and the other half to the town. Danville, Sandown, Hampstead, Exeter, Derry, Atkinson Chester, Auburn and Londonderry are just a few of the many local New Hampshire towns that still have their town pounds. The 1819/1820 Poplin (now Fremont) Town Pound that formerly stood near the corner of Abbott and Sandown Roads was unfortunately bulldozed in during the early 1970's.

Any resident aged 18 or over that is interested in helping to reconstruct this unique piece of Fremont's historic past is invited to show up at the Meeting House on Main Street on Saturday, September 17th at 8:30a.m. for an old-fashioned Town Pound Raising. Donations of food and drink by members of the community are again much appreciated and can be brought to the site before 12 noon. TOWN CLERK UPDATES

The process of changing ownership for a surviving spouse can be completed in its entirety at the Town Clerk's Office (no longer have to go to the DMV for the State portion). Lease transfers can also be completed at the Clerk's office (no longer required to go to the DMV for the State portion). Vanity plates; IANTI, IHCAP and IVVET plates can now be obtained from the Clerk's Office if your vehicle currently has regular ANTI, HCAP or VVET plates. Please call the office at 895-8693 for further details.

Registration Renewals: When renewing your vehicle registration or boat registration in person, you are required to provide the Clerk's office with the current registration or the renewal notice that you received in the mail. This is a State law. If you do not provide either of these documents, the Clerk's office **CANNOT** process the registration renewal without first printing a certified copy of the previous registration for a fee of \$18.00 per registration.

Initial plates can now be obtained at anytime throughout the year. You can search the availability of an initial plate by visiting the Division of Motor Vehicles website at <u>www4.egov.nh.gov/platecheck</u>. Initial plates are issued on a first come, first served basis. Initial passenger plates are available with seven digits; conservation "Moose" plates are available with six digits and Motorcycle plates are available with five digits. The initial plate fee is \$40. Feel free to call the Clerk's Office for more information at 895-8693.

Registration estimates can be obtained by visiting the Town Clerk's page on the Town's website at <u>www.fremont.nh.gov</u>. Once there, click on the link right below the heading: VEHICLE RENEWALS and DOG LICENSING RENEWALS ON-LINE 24/7. LIBRARY DIRECTOR POSITION OPENING

The Town of Fremont is accepting applications for a part-time Library Director to oversee operations of the Fremont Public Library. Director oversees a part-time staff of 3-4 to include a Children's Librarian, Young Adult Librarian and up to two other assistant staff members. The position is approximately 30-35 hours per week, permanent part-time, hourly/non-exempt and reports to a three member board of Library Trustees.

The Director directs and coordinates the daily operations of the Fremont Public Library. Other duties include: staff scheduling and oversight, budget development and implementation; purchasing and maintaining materials, management of personnel and discipline, and staff development. Director works closely with the Library Trustees and should be able to plan, organize, develop and direct a comprehensive program of library services, be responsive to the needs and preferences of patrons. Director needs the ability to organize data and keep clear and accurate records, prepare reports and maintain effective working relationships with patrons, the community, subordinates, other Town Departments, and the Library Trustees.

Effective written and oral communication skills are essential to the position. Comprehensive knowledge of library systems, principles, practices, procedures, tools, and new and emerging technologies necessary, with considerable knowledge of management principles and library administration as well as the Town of Fremont. Position requires a background in Education and/or Library Science/Administration, including a minimum of five years experience in a Library setting, preferably at a management or supervisory level. Salary commensurate with experience.

TOWN OF FREMONT NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Fremont Conservation Commission, with the Open Space Advisory Committee and Board of Selectmen, will hold a public hearing on Thursday September 29, 2011 at 7:30 pm at the Fremont Town Hall, pursuant to NH RSA 36-A:4 and 5 to discuss acceptance and expenditure of monies to the Conservation Fund, and discuss purchase of land to be used as conservation land, with potential easements, on property in Fremont.

Grant funding has been secured for a portion of the purchase price. Additional funding will come from the land use change tax fund managed by the Fremont Conservation Commission and a bond authorization approved by voters in 2005. The public is welcome to attend.
