
APPRECIATION

Neal began his law enforcement career with the Exeter Police Department on February 14, 1969. When he left Exeter, he spent many years with the Rockingham County Sheriff's Department. He retired from Rockingham County in 1994 and took up the business of serving Fremont on a more permanent basis. He was first elected Chief in Fremont on March 13, 1989, having been an officer here since 1987. He is currently Fremont's longest standing Police Chief.

During his tenure as Fremont's Police Chief, Neal has seen the implementation of the Town's first full-time police officer, Charles Rand in 1996; from fully part-time officers to the current staffing of three full-time officers. He helped in the planning and construction of the Fremont Safety Complex, watched the combination of the former Rescue Squad with the Fremont Fire Department; and seen our population grow from some 2,500 to nearly the 4,500 residents who today call Fremont home. The Fremont Police Department has made many great strides under Neal's tenure.

Over the years Neal has participated in Cable Advisory Committees, the Complex Building Committee, and many a search committee for town employees. He has been a Supervisor of the Checklist since 2007. He is active in all of our weather-related emergencies, and employs a "TEAM" approach. He is always there during times of emergency and Town need, willing to help whoever and however he can.
