Combined, Peter and Gene have spent nearly 30 years serving the Town of Fremont from the Selectmen's Office. In that capacity, they have also served as representatives from the Board of Selectmen to the Budget Committee and the Planning Board.

Within their years of service the Town has planned and built the Fremont Safety Complex, the Fremont Public Library, rebuilt the Sandown Road Bridge, and renovated the playing area at Memorial Fields.



Peter was elected Selectman in 1990 and served six years through March 1995. He took some time off, and agreed to fill a vacancy for a short time and ran for the balance of a one year term 2004-2005; and was then re-elected for another three year term from 2005-2008.

Peter also served as Superintendent of Cemeteries from 1990 - 1994.

He served on the Planning Board in 1988 - 1989 as well.

Peter served as a Fremont Representative to ERLAC.

Peter participates with the Open Space Advisory Committee and the Energy Committee.

Gene was first elected Selectman in 1991 on a write-in campaign after the death of Len Bonagura in office. Previously he had served for six years on the Fremont Planning Board from 1986 to 1991, when he became elected Selectman.

Gene is very active with the Fremont Energy Committee and their ongoing projects.

Both are avid outdoorsmen and members of the NH Timberland Owners Association, Rockingham County Woodland Owners Association, and dedicated Fremont Bulky Day Volunteers.
