We dedicate the 2022 Annual Town Report to members of our Community, once active in Town government, who left us this past year.

Dennis Howland served on the Zoning Board of Adjustment from 2013 through 2022 and Chaired the Open Space Committee for many of the years from 2009 to 2022. He was “out in the woods” marking and caring for trails, doing much of the carpentry required to fix or create access and safe passage. Dennis was a consistent Bulky Day Volunteer and assistant to the Fremont Garden Club with his wife Mary Kaltenbach.

Paul Stevens was a Fremont Police Officer from 1981 to 1986. He was a Sergeant in the US Army with Two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star Medal. He lived in Fremont for the past 46 years and was predeceased by his wife Bobbi, a Fremont election worker for 40 years.

Richard “Dick” Burleigh marched in Fremont Memorial Day Parades for more than 50 years. He was recognized by the Town in 2016 for that participation, and continued to march as long as he was able. Dick was a Fremont native and US Army Veteran.

Fred Tidd and his family have lived in Fremont for decades. Fred was an Assistant Cub and Boy Scout Leader in Town for many years.

Susan Bonagura was the Town’s Welfare Director for many years unofficially, and appointed to the position formally when she became a United States citizen. Sue maintained dual citizenship in her native Australia. She was an active member of the Fremont Garden Club as well.

Robert Stiner served on the Fremont Conservation Commission. Bob enlisted in the US Navy during WWII. He loved raising horses & cattle at their property on scenic Scribner Road.

Maurice Robinson often helped the Town with his quality carpentry skills. He made one of our map tables that still sits at Town Hall. Much of his large family resides in Fremont

Kirsten Butler was the longtime owner & operator of Fremont’s *Country Club For Kids Daycare*. Kristy served with the Parks & Recreation Commission with adult activities and did much to help our youth at Pinkerton Academy as a certified counselor. With her family very involved in the Fremont Fire Rescue Department, she was a constant to be counted on for food and support!
