## Earl F Turner

Earl Turner was a Fremont Selectman from 1966 to 1968. He operated Turner Mills on Scribner Road and with members of his family, rebuilt Turner's Dam in 1964. Earl also worked on the historic restoration of the Meetinghouse in 1992.

## Lillian B Pratt

Lillian was awarded the Boston Post Cane on September 10, 2010 as the Town's eldest resident. Lillian was also a distinguished Gold Star Mother and honored us annually at the Town's Memorial Day Ceremonies, having lost her son Philip in 1969 during the Vietnam War.

## **Lloyd Metevier**

Lloyd was a lifelong resident of Fremont who served many years with the Fremont Fire Department, retiring as a Captain. Lloyd marched in the Town's Memorial Day Parade for 50 years, and assisted the Town for many of those years, coordinating the Ceremony.

He coached Fremont Little League and was a member of the Planning Board.

He was also a US Air Force Veteran.

## Joseph G Bolduc Sr

Joe was a longtime resident of Fremont. He served the Town as Police Chief between 1963 and 1973; and Road Agent from 1950 to 1976, also serving with the Fremont Fire Department. Many of his children and their families are active in the Fremont Community.
