The Fremont Food Pantry saw its busiest year in 2010. In the past few years the numbers of families that we service, continues to surpass numbers of the previous year.

We continued to service residents in need year round by appointment, which averages to be three to five families per week. We were also able to provide residents our annual Holiday food baskets at Easter, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving and Christmas. All of which included all the trimmings for beautiful holiday meals, plus extras for that special touch.

With so many of our residents facing hard economic times, we were concerned as to how well we would be able to continue into the Fall/Winter season.
