Ellis School Notes of Interest from *the History of Fremont NH Olde Poplin*

In 1944 voters established a Capital Reserve Fund for constructing and equipping a centralized school. Monies continued to be added to the fund until a vote passed in 1950 to proceed.

Mr John Ellis donated the land as well as \$5,000 for the new central school, on the condition that the school be named in honor of his late wife, Pauline B (Hawes) Ellis. Mrs Ellis was a respected Fremont teacher, who taught in the community for 25 years.
