
# Our Accomplishments for the year:


### February:

 Snow and ice sculpture competition - over 20 creative submissions were received and posted on our Facebook page. The winner received a Stillwell's ice cream gift certificate.

# April:

Fremont Parks and Recreation with help from the Easter Bunny hosted our Annual Egg Hunt which was held at Ellis School.

  - Participants received raffle tickets for Fremont businesses.
  - Over 109 blue trash bags were collected.



#### May:

  - This tradition is meant to bring a small and good fortune to those such as an elderly person, someone sick, or even someone that was having a difficult year.
  - Popular through the 19th and 20th centuries, a basket or cone containing spring flowers and sweets on would be left on doorsteps, usually anonymously.
